32-year-old Erin of the Winnebago Tribe is happy to have turned her life around. Not too long ago, she was living in a shelter, but she recently moved into her own home. *"I've hit every obstacle in life that you could possibly think of, and I overcame all of them. I can't believe it! Here I am today with my kids, just happy."*

Erin has five children ranging in ages from 6 months to 13 years old. She gets supplies for her two youngest children, including her infant Ky'rece, through PWNA's Healthy Living Service.

Carmen, one of our Healthy Living Program Partners, gets regular deliveries of home and hygiene items that she passes on to those in need. These products motivate families to come in for things like immunizations and checkups.

*"When the incentives come in, it's a big help for me,"* Erin says. *"We really go through the wipes, diapers, body wash... Even dental floss means a lot. The little things make a big difference where we live."* Items like hats and socks are especially important for the cold Nebraska winters, so Ky'rece has new winter gear to keep him warm!

Our Program Partner Adonica with the Zuni Senior Center in New Mexico utilizes our Emergency Food Box service to drive community engagement and provide Elders with vital supplies.

Elders at the senior center received nonperishable food items like rice, beans, pasta, canned foods, and other goods that are not always affordable or accessible.

Through various programs offered by the senior center, Adonica hopes to improve quality of life for Elders like 77-year-old Florence, who shared, *"What [PWNA] gives us like food, water, and cleaning stuff helps."*

Florence is a proud mother of 5, grandmother of 18, and great-grandmother of 7. *"All my kids are scattered. I live with my daughter and granddaughter, but they both have to work, so I'm home all by myself,"* said Florence. The day-to-day loneliness brought Florence to the senior center where she has been a regular for 9 years.

Florence is grateful for the support she receives and would like to thank the donors who support PWNA's Emergency Food Box service. *"It's helping not just me, but everyone who comes here,"* she told us. *"Keep helping people and thank you. Every little bit helps!"*
